Rules and Guidelines

Pupils are invited to design the official ISA email signature banner for Christmas. We will be looking for the most festive and eye-catching design to adorn all ISA emails throughout December 2024.

Eligibility

This competition is open to ISA Members' schools only. Schools can submit a maximum of five entries in total spread across the categories. Pupils can enter individually or as a group. Individual pupils can submit one entry only. Groups can submit one entry only. Individual pupils may submit once as an individual and once as a member of a group.

We encourage schools to run their own competition in house and submit their successful entries in the competition.

At ISA, we are committed to making our opportunities accessible, we welcome applications from all pupils, including those with learning difficulties or disabilities. Alternative formats of these guidelines are available on request. Please allow us enough notice to provide the document accordingly if required.

How to enter

Entries must be submitted via the online entry form on the ISA website [here](#) by **Wednesday 27 November 2024**. Submit your entries in PNG, JPEG or PDF format only.

Please name your file with the school name followed by the pupil or group name e.g. SchoolName_JohnSmith

Rules

- All participants must use the template available to download on the ISA website
- Designs can be either handmade or digital, and either black and white or in colour
- Each participant can use only one template for their entry
- No wording must feature on the banner
- Digital art may be used
- While we recognise the potential benefit of AI, we kindly request that participants are using it for inspiration and support rather than using it to generate their artwork. Please include details about your creative process under "any special circumstances" box if applicable, so judges are aware.
